Overnight guests enjoy an extended tour of the home. The staff is well versed in Borden lore and the history of the era. A full hot breakfast, reminiscent of the meal served to the Bordens on the morning of the murders (with the omission of the three day old mutton broth) is

prepared and served by our staff. Evening snacks are served.

and Points East**

Take I-195W to Exit 7, (Fall River). Bear left. *\*(see below)*.  
*Approximate travel time: 20 minutes.*

**From Boston  
and Points North**

Take Rte. 24S to I-195W. to Exit 7. (Fall River). Bear left. *\*(see below)*  
*Approximate travel time: 60 minutes*

**From Newport  
and Points South**

Take Rte. 138N to Rte. 24N to I-195W. to Exit 7, (Fall River) Bear left. *\*(see below)*  
*Approximate travel time: 30 minutes*

*\* Take Rte. 81S, turn right at Walgreens (Rodman St.), turn right at second light (Second St.). Borden House is on the right after St. Mary's Cathedral.*

# THE FALL RIVER TRAGEDY

August 4, 1892 dawned with the promise of a warm summer day. No one ever suspected the horror that would occur in this manufacturing city in the mid-morning hours.

The bodies of the elderly Mr. and Mrs. Andrew J. Borden were discovered bludgeoned within the home. Theories surrounding the crime abounded. The murders became an international sensation. Many were shocked when Mr. Borden's thirty-two year old unmarried daughter, Lizzie, was charged with the double homicide.

Following a sensational thirteen day trial, Lizzie Borden was acquitted of the crimes. She returned to her home at 92 Second Street for a brief period. Miss Borden remained in Fall River for the duration of her life.

Over one hundred years later, the unsolved mystery continues to perplex and fascinate many. The crime has inspired countless articles, books, documentaries, plays, operas, rock n' roll band and a made for tv movie.
